#### An Update from Rotherham Foodbank forwarded by Roger Green (2 April 2021)

I seem to recall someone mentioning recently that you would like an update on the amount of stock that Rotary Sitwell have donated to the foodbank during the lockdown period. I've just flicked through the statistics and elicited these remarkable figures.

Total Weight Donated: 14,322 tonnes

Meals Provided: 6,015!!!!!

Once again, I can only thank everyone who has been involved in this incredible effort. You guys have pretty much sustained us through this Covid period and make it possible for us to help literally thousands of people.

You have also provided us with stock to help keep us going through these coming summer months when donations tend to decline significantly and when I suspect the economic fallout will mean an increasingly high demand for the foodbank - as attention starts to focus on the return to relative normality. It is worth noting that our three busiest months since lockdown have been the last three, with March figures not showing any kind of decline from the February figures as would normally be expected.
